Attendance

It is a legal requirement that your child attends school every day unless an illness or other important matter prevents this. If a student misses as little as 8 days in a school term, by the end of primary school, they will have missed over a year of school.

Please ensure that the school is notified as soon as possible if your child/children are absent from school. Parents/caregivers can complete the absentee form on the skoolbag app or contact the school directly on 4566 8231. Alternatively, a note may be sent to school with your child/children upon their return. The note must indicate the specific reason for the absence. This information is required for Departmental records.

Students in years 3 to 6 will be participating in the survey, which will take place this term 1. Consent forms will be sent home by the end of the week – they only need to be returned if you do not wish your child to participate.



MMWaC Connecting to Culture Day

The MMWaC Connecting to Culture Day is a great chance for our school to combine with our neighbouring schools and celebrate Harmony Day. Harmony Day is a celebration of our cultural diversity and the message is 'everyone belongs'.

The students will participate in four different activities that reflect the cultures of South America, Japan, France and Africa. Students may wear orange (orange does not mean red or pink) or cultural dress. If your child does not wear orange or cultural dress, they will be required to wear school uniform.

Premier's Reading Challenge

The Premier's Reading Challenge commenced on Monday 5th March and closes on Friday 31st August 2018. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely. The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is available for all NSW students in Kindergarten to Year 9, in government, independent, Catholic and home schools.

Maroota Public School urges all students to participate in the challenge, we ask parents and carers to support their child by encouraging them to read each day at home, and we will support them to read each day at school.
