Share our Space.

Over the Christmas / Summer break, our school grounds will be open for use. The Share our Space program will run from Monday, 20 December to Thursday, 27 January from 8am to 5pm, including weekends and public holidays. So, feel free to pop on in and to use the oval, playgrounds and sports courts for some good old-fashioned, family fun.

School outdoor spaces will be cleaned every Tuesday and Thursday during the program. Cleaners will clean the space and empty rubbish bins at the school.

There are no toilet facilities open for public use, during the Share our Space program.

Please note that children are to be supervised, at all times, by a responsible adult. There will be no school-based supervision, even if teachers are on the school grounds.

Staff News.

Next year, staffing at Maroota Public School will look different to this year. This year was an exceptional year, with staffing levels sitting significantly above our entitlement. Due to our inability to guarantee our current staff members the level of employment that they require, there will be some staff movement. This has been the direct result of a declining student numbers. We had been lucky enough to 'hold' Mrs Dorbis' permanent position for a couple of years, in the hope of building enrolments but we have been informed that we no longer have that position entitlement. Don't worry, though... as our school continues to grow, we are able to regain this position. Fingers crossed!

Miss Bennett has secured employment at Vineyard Public School. With our staffing entitlement limited to 1 ½ teachers, we were unable to grant Miss Bennett the full-time teaching load that she needed. Of course, we are very sad to see her go. We will miss THAT laugh and her caring and nurturing nature that has benefitted our students for the past 3 years. We thank Miss Bennett for all her hard work and for being an integral part of our Maroota PS family. We hope to see her working at Maroota PS again, soon.

Understandably, with the uncertainty, Mrs Tosh has secured 2 days per week at Cattai PS. She will be working as the teacher librarian and teaching geography and history. We are very hopeful that we will be able to keep her here, at Maroota, one day a week to help us out with our teacher librarian needs (maybe some history and geography, too!). This satisfies Mrs Tosh's 3 day per week teaching load preference. We wish to thank Mrs Tosh for her commitment to all things Maroota, and for the care and kindness afforded to our very lucky MPS students. Fingers crossed we can have her, here, 1 day per week!

The Department of Education has announced that a number of small schools will be granted an Assistant Principal (Curriculum and Instruction). Maroota PS is lucky enough to be one of these schools. We are receiving one staff member, one day per week, which is over and above our entitlement and is unrelated to our budget allocation. This successful applicant is currently being decided through the Merit Selection process. We hope to be able to bring you news of this position before the end of the school year.

I will be a <u>teaching</u> Teaching Principal, there will be the one day per week Assistant Principal (I'm hoping to secure a second day for the successful applicant as a classroom teacher, for consistency) and we are pulling together to make staffing decisions to best utilise the staffing budget that we have. We are also waiting to finalise our enrolments for 2022. Those last few students who may or may not enrol will determine just what our staffing and class structures will look like next year.

Presentation Day and Water Fun Day

Monday, 13th December is Presentation Day. The Presentation Assembly will start at 10am. We ask that students come to school dressed in their school uniform and bring old clothes and shoes (not thongs) to change into. Students will also need to bring a towel or two, in a plastic bag, to make clothing changes and wet clothing transport less horrendous and more organised!

Monday's weather forecast is bleak. Steady rain and low 'Summer' temperatures are predicted. Water Fun Day will still go ahead, regardless, but water activities will be reduced and some 'warmer, dry weather activities' will be planned so that students are not cold and wet all day.
