


MAROOTA MATTERS

We have been learning about the 'hidden' information in texts. We were VERY surprised to realise that there was a great deal of hidden information in a visual, illustrative text and even more in a written text. Authors, creators and composers are very tricky people!




We have also been learning how to improve our sentence writing. By taking a main clause (which must contain a subject and a verb) and adding some adjectives and adverbs and ensuring that there is boundary punctuation, we can make our simple sentence more interesting. Also, by taking two main clauses (remember: they both must contain a subject and a verb) and joining them together, using a conjunction (FANBOYS), we can create a compound sentence. This increases the complexity of our writing and makes it more interesting to read. What will we get up to next?!















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We've also jumped on into our garden (literally AND figuratively!). We loosened up the soil, dug through some chicken manure (courtesy of Gladys, Olive, Irene and Kitty Smith), watered it in, let it sit for a bit, then planted some corn seeds. 
