





After reading, we buddied up with a partner to draw and describe a character from the story. We used our chosen adjectives to write a poem about our character.











And now we have a beautiful new display in our School Office Entry.





#### WHAT IS AN URGENT CARE SERVICE CENTRE?

Urgent Care Service centres are where you go for all those things that need urgent medical attention but aren't life-threatening, and you don't need to go to the emergency department. It's a new type of service brought to you by the Western Sydney Care Collective to get you and your loved ones the right care at the right time in the right place. Urgent Care Services are completely free for those who have a valid Medicare card and are open for extended hours.

#### URGENT CARE SERVICES TREAT:



Wounds and cuts requiring stitches



Minor burns



Minor infections and skin irritations



Muscle injuries



Sprains and fractures



Non-venomous insect and animal bites



Removal of foreign objects from body



Ongoing vomiting and diarrhoea (dehydration concerns)




Other non-life-threatening issues that require urgent attention
